A READING OF THE EPIPHANY STORY

MATTHEW 2:1-12

Leader: In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the

East came to Jerusalem, asking,

People: "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its

rising, and have come to pay him homage."

Leader: When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling

together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the

Messiah was to be born. They told him,

People: "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem,

in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall

come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Leader: Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when

the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying,

People: "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so
